AN ACT to enable Barristers and Solicitors Title.
of the Supreme Court to act as General
Law Practitioners. [3rd July, 1858.]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand
in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:

I. For a period of five years after the passing of this Act it shall be lawful for any Barrister or Solicitor of the Supreme Court to act both as a Barrister and Solicitor within the Colony of New Zealand, and in the several Courts of Justice which now are or shall hereafter be therein erected and constituted. Barristers and Solicitors may act as General Law Practitioners.

II. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Law Short Title.
Practitioners' Act, 1858."
