An Act to grant a retiring allowance to William Martin, Esquire, late Chief Justice of New Zealand.

[10th August, 1858.]

WHEREAS William Martin, Esq., late Chief Justice of the Colony, on the 12th day of June, 1857, resigned his office on the ground of inability to perform the duties thereof, on account of ill health: And whereas by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled, "The Supreme Court Judges Act, 1858," provision is made for granting Superannuation allowances to the Judges of the Supreme Court in certain cases: And whereas the length of service of the said William Martin, as Chief Justice, would have entitled him to an annual allowance of £333 6s. 8d., if he had been enabled to retire under the provisions of the said Act.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Martin's Annuity.

Annuity to be given to William Martin, Esq.

I. There shall be paid to the said William Martin, Esquire, out of the General Revenue of the Colony of New Zealand, an annuity after the rate of £333 6s. 8d. for the term of his natural life.

When to commence.

II. The said annuity shall be deemed to have commenced on the 12th day of June, 1857, and to have been and to be payable quarterly, on the first days of January, April, July, and October in every year.

Short Title.

III. The Short Title of this Act shall be "Martin's Annuity Act, 1858."
