

AN ACT to appropriate the Ordinary Title. Revenue of New Zealand for the year ended the 30th June, 1858.

m f BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand, in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

I. Out of Her Majesty's Revenue arising from the Post Appropriation. Office, Duties of Customs, and Fees and Fines, there may be issued and applied, in manner hereinafter mentioned, any sum of money not exceeding in amount respectively the several sums of money hereinafter specified; that is to say,-

1. To defray the excess of the Expenditure beyond the £6,185 8s. 4d. for excess of expenditure for year ended the 30th day of June, 1857, year ended June 30th

including the guarantee of two thousand two hundred pounds to New Plymouth, the sum of six thousand one hundred and eighty-five pounds eight shillings and fourpence.

2. To defray the salaries, allowances, and contingencies, of the Civil Establishment of the Government of New Zealand for the period commencing with the first day of July, 1857, and ending the 30th day of June, 1858, the sum of thirty thousand three hundred and forty-seven pounds eight shillings and eleven pence; that is to say,—

II. To defray the charge for the Province of New Plymouth, to make up any deficiency in the proceeds of Land Sales within that Province, the sum of two thousand two hundred pounds.

Salaries not exceeding fees, may be paid to Registrars and Deputy Registrars. III. To defray the charges for the service of the Department of Registrars and Deputy Registrars under the "Marriage Act, 1854," and under an Ordinance of the Legislative Council of New Zealand, Session VIII., No. 9, intituled "An Ordinance for

Registering Births, Deaths, and Marriages in the Colony of New Zealand," respectively, for the period commencing the 1st day of July, 1857, and ending on the 30th day of June, 1858, it shall be lawful for the Governor to cause to be paid out of the fees accruing under the said recited Act and Ordinance to any Registrar of Marriages, and any Deputy-Registrar respectively, such salary as the Governor shall think fit, not exceeding in amount the fees received by such Registrar or Deputy Registrar under the said Act or Ordinance, respectively, during the aforesaid period.

The fees, fines, and penalties received in any Province in Fees, &c., in respect respect of any proceedings there before any Resident Magistrates or Justice of the Peace (except the Resident Magistrates whose salaries are payable out of the Civil List) or such part of such fees, fines, and penalties, as would be payable to any Treasurer for the tive Provinces. public uses of the Colony, shall, until the 30th day of June, 1858, be payable and paid to the Treasurers of the several Provinces in which such fees, fines, and penalties, shall respectively have arisen, for the public uses of such Provinces respectively.

V. The Treasurer of the Colony of New Zealand shall issue Sums to be paid by and pay the said several sums to such persons for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, upon such days, and in such proportions, as the Governor by any Warrant to be signed by him, shall from time to time order and direct, and the payments so to be made, shall be charged upon and payable out of such Revenues as aforesaid.

VI. The surplus of the Revenues arising from the Post Office, Duties of Customs, and Fees, and Fines, shall be divided among the Revenues to be divided amongst Provinseveral Provinces established in New Zealand, in the like proportions ces. as the gross proceeds of the said Revenues shall have arisen therein respectively, and shall be paid over to the respective Treasurers of such Provinces by the Treasurer of the Colony, in pursuance of Warrants under the hand of the said Governor, directed to him in that behalf.

VII. The said Treasurer shall, in his accounts, from time to Treasurer to be allowtime, be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any Warrant issued by virtue of this Act, and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid, shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer, in passing his said accounts, for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned.
