**An Act to provide for payment by the Colonial Treasurer to the Provincial Treasuries of certain Provinces of sums paid to him under the "Land Revenue Appropriation Act 1858" for the Extinguishment of Native Title to Lands in such Provinces.**

**WHEREAS** under certain provisions of the "Land Revenue Appropriation Act 1858" the sixth of the gross Revenue and Receipts which have arisen from the sale letting disposal and occupation of Waste Land of the Crown in the Provinces of Auckland Wellington Hawke's Bay and Taranaki since the first day of January 1858 has been paid by the Receivers of Land Revenue in such Provinces to the Colonial Treasurer for the purpose of providing a fund for the Extinguishment of Native Title over land in the said Provinces :

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the payment over to the Provincial Governments of the several Provinces within which the same have arisen of the said one-sixth parts of the said Land Revenue :

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :

I. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Land Revenue Appropriation Act Amendment Act (No. 1) 1862."

II. After the passing of this Act the several sums paid by the Receivers of Land Revenue to the Colonial Treasurer under the provisions of the "Land Revenue Appropriation Act 1858" for the Extinguishment of Native Title to Land in the several Provinces of Auckland Wellington Taranaki and Hawke's Bay shall be paid by the Colonial Treasurer to the Provincial Treasuries of such several Provinces respectively for the public use hereof subject to the appropriation of the respective Provincial Legislatures.
