BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows— I. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The New Zealand Post Short Title.

The power conferred by "The New Zealand Post Office Act 1858" on the Governor in Council to fix alter and abolish rates of postage and to make rules for regulating Post Office services shall not be deemed to be limited altered or affected by an Act of the General Assembly passed in the present Session of Parliament intituled "The New Zealand Post Office Act Amendment Act 1866" Provided that the Governor in Council shall have no power to alter the rates of postage fixed in the said last-mentioned Act for the particular service therein mentioned but shall have power to fix alter or abolish rates of postage for other services than those specially provided for in the said last-mentioned Act.
