AN ACT to amend "The Law Practitioners Act Amendment Act 1865." Title.
[8th October 1866.]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows—

I. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Law Practitioners Act Amendment Act 1866." Short Title.

II. The provisions of the third and fourth sections of "The Law Practitioners Act Amendment Act 1865" shall be deemed to extend to all persons who shall have been at any time heretofore or shall hereinafter be appointed to be Registrars or Deputy Registrars of the Supreme Court of the Colony of New Zealand and the said Act shall be construed and read as if the words "Registrar or Deputy Registrar of the Supreme Court" had been inserted in the third section of the said Act immediately before the word "Secretary" where it occurs in the said third section of the said Act. Registrars or Deputy Registrars of the Supreme Court qualified for admission.

III. No person who has or shall have been convicted in any part of the British dominions of forgery or perjury or subornation of perjury shall be enrolled or admitted to practice or shall practise as a Barrister or Solicitor in New Zealand and if any person who has or shall have been so convicted shall at any time hereafter practise as a Barrister or Solicitor of the Supreme Court of New Zealand such person shall be liable to pay a penalty of five hundred pounds for every such offence Provided always that nothing herein contained shall except as is herein specially provided be deemed to alter or affect the existing powers of the Supreme Court or any Judge thereof to refuse to enrol or admit to practice as a Barrister or Solicitor any person whomsoever or to affect the summary jurisdiction of the said Court or any Judge thereof over Barristers and Solicitors Provided also that nothing herein contained shall apply to any person who has obtained a free pardon for such forgery or perjury. Penalty for practising after being convicted of forgery perjury &c.

IV. So much of section seventeen of "The Law Practitioners Act 1861" as provides that no Solicitor shall have more than two Clerks at one time bound by contract in writing to serve him as Clerks as in section sixteen of the said Act provided is hereby repealed.

V. This Act shall come into operation on the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.
