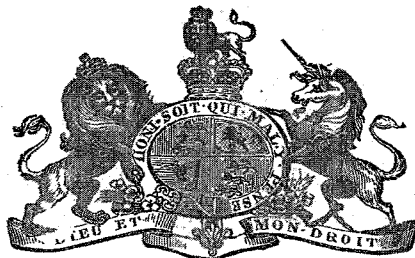

AN ACT to amend "The Town Districts Act, 1881."

Title.

[30th August, 1889.]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Town Districts Act Amendment Act, 1889." Short Title.

2. Every elector who is duly qualified to vote at any election of Commissioners under "The Town Districts Act, 1881," shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be qualified to be elected a Commissioner under the said Act. Every elector qualified to be elected as a Commissioner.

3. The third paragraph of section sixteen of the said Act commencing with the words "At the first election," is hereby repealed. Repeal.
