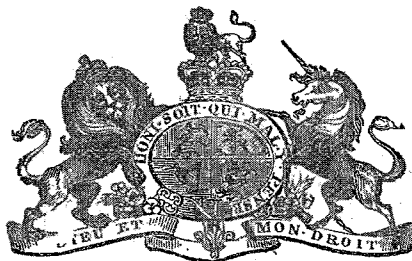

Title.

AN ACT to amend "The Mercantile Law Act, 1880."

[2nd September, 1889.]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short Title.

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Mercantile Law Act Amendment Act, 1889."

2. Doubts having arisen as to the applicability of the provisions of "The Mercantile Law Act, 1880," hereinafter mentioned, to and in respect of navigable lakes and inland navigable waters of the colony, it is hereby declared and enacted that the provisions of the said Act contained in sections twenty-one to forty, both inclusive, shall extend and apply and be deemed at all times to have extended and applied to all parts of the colony, so far as the same may be applicable.
