Title.

An Act to appropriate certain Sums of Money for Public Works and Other Purposes. [16th September, 1889.

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,—Whereas under the authority of several Acts in that behalf certain unexpended balances of loans raised or to be raised were, upon the thirty-first day of March, in the present year, standing to the credit of the three parts of the Public Works Fund, particularly described in "The Public Works Appropriation Act, 1887," that is to say, to the credit of Part I. three hundred and ninety-one thousand seven hundred and seventyfive pounds, to the credit of Part II. four hundred and thirty-five thousand eight hundred and seventeen pounds, to the credit of Part III. six hundred and eighteen thousand and seventy-eight pounds, and it is expedient that a portion of such sums severally should be appropriated to the several purposes and services to which the same are applicable:

We, Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the House of Representatives of New Zealand, in Parliament assembled, have resolved to grant unto Your Majesty, towards making good the Supply which we have cheerfully granted to your Majesty in this session of Parliament, the sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore most

humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as fol-

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Public Works Appropriation Act, 1889."

2. The Colonial Treasurer may issue and apply—

(1.) Out of the said balance of three hundred and ninety-one thousand seven hundred and seventy-five pounds standing to the credit of Part I and in addition to the sum of one

hundred and ninety-eight thousand five hundred and thirtyseven pounds authorised to be issued by the several Acts mentioned in Part I. of the First Schedule hereto, any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of fifty-nine thousand seven hundred and eightythree pounds towards defraying the expenses of the several works and services mentioned in the Second Schedule:

- (2.) And, out of the said balance of four hundred and thirty-five of £78,935. thousand eight hundred and seventeen pounds standing to the credit of Part II., and in addition to the sum of six thousand five hundred and fifty-one pounds authorised to be issued by the several Acts mentioned in Part II. of the First Schedule hereto, any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of seventy-eight thousand nine hundred and thirty-five pounds towards defraying the expenses of the several works and services men-
- tioned in the Third Schedule: (3.) And, out of the said balance of six hundred and eighteen of £247,927. thousand and seventy-eight pounds standing to the credit of Part III., and in addition to the sum of forty-three thousand nine hundred and eighty-eight pounds authorised to be issued by the several Acts mentioned in Part III. of the First Schedule hereto, any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of two hundred and forty-seven thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven pounds towards defraying the expenses of the several works and services mentioned in the Fourth Schedule.
- 3. All sums so issued shall be applied as mentioned in the Appropriation several votes set forth in the first column in the Second, Third, and of grants. Fourth Schedules towards defraying so much of the expenses incurred or to be incurred in the several works and services mentioned in the said Schedules as shall come in the course of payment during the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and to no other purposes whatsoever.
- 4. It shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on Amount of liabilities behalf of Her Majesty the Queen, to enter into any contract or which may be incurred. contracts, or to incur any liabilities, for carrying on the works and services for which money is appropriated by this Act: Provided that the amount of liability so incurred in respect of each vote shall not, together with the sum appropriated by such vote, exceed the sum set down in the second column in the Second, Third, and Fourth Schedules opposite to each vote severally.
- 5. For the purpose of the ninth section of "The Public Revenues Moneys may be Act, 1882," as amended by the third section of "The Public Revenues issued after 31st March, 1890. Act, 1883," the unexpended balance of any vote under this Act shall be deemed to be the unexpended balance of the vote in the first column of the appropriations, together with an amount not exceeding one-fourth part of the difference between the amount of the vote and the amount to which the Government is authorised to enter into contracts under the provisions of this Act; and notwithstanding anything in "The Public Revenues Act, 1878," or any other Act, moneys

6. Nothing in this Act shall limit the authority of the Colonial Treasurer to issue and pay any moneys which he may be otherwise authorised to issue and pay under the authority of the forty-fourth

section of "The Public Revenues Act, 1878." 7. The sum of one thousand pounds mentioned in Class VIII. of

the Second Schedule to this Act shall be issued and paid by way of an Board to repay advance to the Greymouth Harbour Board for the purposes therein £1,000 to the Public Works mentioned, and shall be repaid by the said Board to the Colonial Fund. Treasurer within three months from the passing of this Act without any interest, and may be so repaid either in one sum or in several sums out of the special fund account of the Harbour Fund created by or under "The Greymouth Harbour Board Act, 1884;" and when so repaid shall form part of the Public Works Fund. The said sum shall be accepted by the persons to whom the same is payable by the Board in full satisfaction of all claims and demands which such persons now have or may have had against the said Board in respect of the matters mentioned in the said Second Schedule or otherwise arising thereout or therefrom.

Indemnity.

8. And whereas the Colonial Treasurer has, under the authority of the forty-fourth section of "The Public Revenues Act, 1878," issued from the Public Account, during the twelve months ended the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, moneys in excess of or without the appropriation of Parliament, amounting in the whole to eighteen thousand six hundred and thirtythree pounds two shillings and tenpence, and has applied the said sum to the several purposes and services mentioned in the Fifth Schedule hereto annexed: Be it enacted that the application of the said sums is hereby sanctioned.

Moneys may be

paid over to local bodies for expenditure.

9. The moneys appropriated by this Act for the construction of public roads, and such other public works as are usually constructed by or are under the control of local governing bodies, may be paid over to such local governing body or bodies as the Minister for Public Works or other Minister, acting on his behalf, may determine, upon such terms and conditions as shall be agreed upon between the said Minister and any such local governing body, to be expended by such body upon any of the works or services for which the same are appropriated by this Act; and the Colonial Treasurer shall make all such payments in accordance with any such agreement.

Schedules to be part of this Act.

10. The Schedules from one to six, both inclusive, annexed hereto, with the notes, if any, to such Schedules, shall be deemed to be part of this Act, in the same manner as if they had been contained in the body hereof.
