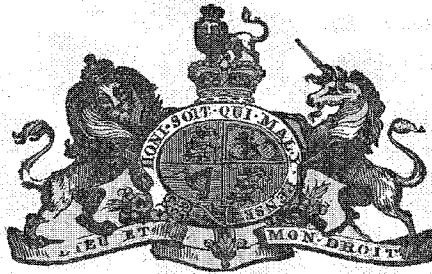

AN ACT to authorise the Sale of a certain Public Reserve in the Borough of Waimate. Title.
[16th September, 1889.]

WHEREAS the lands in the Schedule hereto have been duly reserved for Provincial Government purposes, and are no longer required for such purposes: And whereas the said lands are now vested in Her Majesty, and it is expedient that the same should be sold: Preamble.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is “The Waimate Public Reserve Sale Act, 1889.” Short Title.

2. The Governor may declare that the lands mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall cease to be reserved, and thereupon may direct that the said lands may be sold under “The Land Act, 1885,” at such price as the Canterbury Land Board may appoint. Reserve in Schedule may be sold.

SCHEDULE.

Schedule.

ALL that parcel of land in the Canterbury Land District, being Reserve No. 391 (in red), containing by admeasurement 1 rood 39 perches, more or less, being Lots 134 and 135 in the Borough of Waimate; and bounded towards the north-east by Lot 133, 250 links; towards the south-east by Paul Street, 190 links; towards the south-west by Victoria Terrace, 254 links; and towards the north-west by Lots 118 and 119, 200 links: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less; as the same is delineated on the map deposited in the District Survey Office, Christchurch.
