MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,—We, Your Majesty's most Address. dutiful and loyal subjects, the House of Representatives of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, towards making good the supply which we have cheerfully granted to Your Majesty in this session of Parliament, have resolved to grant unto Your Majesty the sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted: And be it enacted by the General

Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act, 1923.

Grant and appropriation of £15,431,206, and fees, out of Consolidated Fund.

Short Title.

- 2. (1.) The Minister of Finance may issue and apply out of the Consolidated Fund, towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the services of the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, any sums which, together with the sums that have been issued and paid under the provisions of section forty-three of the Public Revenues Act, 1910, and the several Imprest Supply Acts passed during this present session, do not exceed the sum of fifteen million four hundred and thirty-one thousand two hundred and six pounds, together with the amount of the fees hereinafter mentioned.
- (2.) The sum of fifteen million four hundred and thirty-one thousand two hundred and six pounds as aforesaid, together with the fees collected by such public officers as are authorized to retain the same in lieu of salary, is hereby appropriated for the services and purposes expressed in the several votes specified in the First Schedule hereto.
- 3. (1.) The Minister of Finance may issue and apply out of the Public Works Fund, towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the services as aforesaid, any sums which, together with the sums that have been issued and paid under the provisions of section forty-three of the Public Revenues Act, 1910, and the several Imprest Supply Acts passed during this present session, do not exceed the sum of six million twenty-one thousand three hundred and thirteen pounds.
- (2.) The sum of six million twenty-one thousand three hundred and thirteen pounds as aforesaid is hereby appropriated for the works and services expressed in the several votes specified in the Second Schedule hereto.
- (3.) Where any of the moneys appropriated by this section for the construction, maintenance, and supervision of roads, bridges, and other public works are by the estimates for the current financial year as approved by the House of Representatives allocated for the construction, maintenance, or supervision of any particular road or bridge, the moneys so allocated, or any portion thereof, may be expended for the construction or maintenance of any other road or bridge (within the district of the same local authority) for which no specific provision is made by the said estimates.
- 4. (1.) The Minister of Finance may issue and apply out of the respective accounts mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto, towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the services as aforesaid, any sums which, together with the sums that have been issued and paid under the provisions of section forty-three of the Public Revenues Act, 1910, and the several Imprest Supply Acts passed during this present session, do not exceed the sum of seven hundred and seventy-nine thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight pounds.
- (2.) The sum of seven hundred and seventy-nine thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight pounds as aforesaid is hereby appropriated

5. (1.) The Minister of Finance may issue and apply out of Grant and the accounts outside the Public Account mentioned in the Fourth appropriation of £1,007,191 Schedule hereto, towards making good the supplies granted to His out of accounts Majesty for the services as aforesaid, any sums which, together with Account. the sums that have been issued and paid under the provisions of section forty-three of the Public Revenues Act, 1910, and the several Imprest Supply Acts passed during this present session, do not exceed the sum of one million seven thousand one hundred and ninety-one pounds.

(2.) The sum of one million seven thousand one hundred and ninety-one pounds as aforesaid is hereby appropriated for the services

and purposes expressed in the said Fourth Schedule.

6. It shall be lawful for the Governor-General, in the name and Power to make on behalf of His Majesty the King, to enter into any contracts, or contracts in excess of appropriation. to incur any liabilities, for carrying on the works and services for which money is appropriated by this Act:

Provided that in the case of the works and services specified in the Fifth Schedule hereto the amount of liability thereby incurred shall not, together with the sum appropriated therefor, exceed the sum set down in the ninth column in that Schedule opposite to each such work or service.

7. - (d.) The payment of salaries, allowances, and travelling-expenses, and the wages of workers:

(e.) The purchase of material and provisions:

- (f.) The purchase of furniture and fittings for public buildings, and the payment of wages and purchase of furniture, provisions, and other necessaries for the maintenance of sanatoria and other establishments for which money is appropriated:

Provided that such tickets shall be issued only for the purpose of enabling the member to come from his home to Wellington or to return home from Wellington.

(2.) Every such ticket shall be paid for out of moneys to be appropriated by Parliament for the purpose.

(3.) No member to whom this section applies shall be entitled to receive any payment under section nineteen of the Civil List Act, 1920, in respect of fares for any passage by sea made after the passing of this Act.

(4.) This section shall continue in force until it is specifically repealed.

Authorizing Minister of Public Works to undertake remedial and protective works on behalf of Taieri River Trust. 1923, No. 45.]

- 17. Whereas the lands comprised in the Taieri River Trust District have recently suffered extensive damage by reason of extraordinary floods: And whereas it is essential that such damage be repaired and that further protective works be carried out: And whereas it has been agreed that such works should be carried out on behalf of the Taieri River Trust by the Minister of Public Works out of moneys to be provided in the first instance from the Public Works Fund: And whereas it has been further agreed that half the cost of such works shall be borne by the Public Works Fund: And whereas the estimated cost of such works is one hundred and fifty thousand pounds: Be it therefore enacted as follows:—
- (1.) Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding subsection, the Minister of Public Works, acting on behalf of the Taieri River Trust, is hereby empowered to undertake and carry out all works required for remedying the damage caused as hereinbefore recited to lands situated within the Taieri River Trust District and for constructing further protective works. For the purposes of such works there may, without further appropriation than this section, be issued and paid out of the Public Works Fund such amounts as may from time to time be required, not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of one hundred and fifty thousand pounds.
- (2.) The Minister of Public Works shall not commence to exercise the powers conferred on him by the foregoing provisions of this section unless and until the Taieri River Trust has obtained the consent of the ratepayers to raise a special loan not exceeding seventy-five thousand pounds towards the cost of such works, and has agreed with the Minister of Public Works to pay to the Public Works Fund from time to time as the Minister may require, out of such loan, an amount not exceeding one-half of the cost of the construction of the aforesaid works. The Taieri River Trust is hereby empowered, with the consent of the ratepayers, to raise a special loan for the purposes of the works referred to in this section.

(3.) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in section fifteen of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, as amended by section two of the Local Bodies' Loans Amendment Act, 1921, any authority conferred on the Taieri River Trust to borrow the moneys hereinbefore referred to shall not lapse by reason of the fact that no part of such moneys may be borrowed within five years after the taking of the

poll of ratepayers.

(4.) This section shall continue in force until it is specifically repealed.

18. Whereas on the fourteenth day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, the Tamaki West Road Board, purporting to act pursuant to the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, caused to be taken a poll of ratepayers upon a proposal to raise a special loan of twelve thousand pounds for the improvement and extension of the reticulation and plant of the electric light and power service (including

Enabling Tamaki West Road Board to pay certain loanmoneys into General Account by way of refund. engineering charges and contingent expenditure in connection with the scheme): And whereas the said proposal was duly carried: And whereas the said Board, prior to taking any steps for raising the said loan, had expended out of the Road Board Fund certain moneys for the purposes of the aforesaid works: And whereas the loanmoneys cannot lawfully be applied for the purpose of repaying to the Road Board Fund the moneys expended as aforesaid: And whereas it is desired to confer on the Board the power to make such refund: Be it therefore enacted as follows:—

The Tamaki West Road Board is hereby empowered to transfer from its Loan Account in respect of the aforesaid loan, to the Road Board Fund, an amount not exceeding the amount expended by it as aforesaid out of its Road Board Fund for the purposes for which the

said loan was raised.

19. All loan-moneys heretofore deposited with the Public validating deposit Trustee by the Otago Harbour Board, the Opunake Harbour Board, with Public Trustee the Palmerston North Borough Council, the Manawatu - Oroua certain local Electric-power Board, and the Whangarei Harbour Board respectively shall be deemed to have been lawfully so deposited, and such moneys or any part thereof, together with the interest from time to time accruing thereon, may remain so deposited until required by the Board or Council depositing the same for the purposes for which such moneys were borrowed.

20. Whereas the Whakatane Borough Council, in anticipation Empowering Whakatane Borough of raising a loan for the purpose of an hydro-electric scheme, incurred certain liabilities under contracts for the supply of necessary plant interest on certain and materials, to an amount not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of five thousand three hundred pounds: And whereas it is desired to empower the said Council to pay interest, as hereinafter provided, on the amount of the several accounts comprised within the aforesaid sum: Be it therefore enacted as follows:—

Council to pay

(1.) The Whakatane Borough Council is hereby empowered, out of its Electric Light and Power Loan Account, to pay interest (whether simple or compound), at such rate as the Minister of Finance may in each case approve, on the amount of any account comprised within the aforesaid sum of five thousand three hundred pounds for the period elapsing between the due date of payment and the date on which payment was actually made:

Provided that the total amount to be paid by way of interest under the authority conferred by this section shall not exceed the

sum of one hundred and ninety pounds.

(2.) All amounts heretofore paid by the said Council by way of interest shall, to the extent to which they may be approved by the Minister of Finance, be deemed to have been as lawfully paid as if this section had been in force at the time of payment.

21. (1.) Section twenty-three of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, Increasing powers of as amended by section five of the Local Bodies' Loans Amendment Act, 1922, is hereby further amended by omitting from subsection one the words "one halfpenny," and substituting the words "three farthings."

(2.) Section twenty-four of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, is hereby amended by omitting the words "thirty feet," and substituting the words "twenty feet."

22. (1.) Moneys received by the Crown from the sale of stores or material, or as payment for services, or as recoveries in respect of expenditure, or as fees, or in respect of interdepartmental charges and adjustments of accounts, may, as the Treasury from time to time determines, be credited to the relative rote, and shall be known as credits in aid of that vote.

(2.) In preparing the estimates of the expenditure for any year the sums estimated to be received in that year as credits in aid of any vote shall be deducted from the total estimated expenditure for that vote for the year, and the amounts so estimated to be received as credits in aid shall be appropriated in the Appropriation

Act of the year for the services of such vote:

Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to authorize the expenditure from any vote of any moneys in excess of the amounts appropriated for the services of that vote, otherwise than in respect of credits in aid, and the amount actually received in that year as

credits in aid of that vote.

(3.) Any surplus in respect of any vote arising either from an excess of the moneys actually received as credits in aid over the amount estimated to be so received, or by way of reduction of expenditure, may, with the approval of the Treasury, be temporarily applied for the purposes of that vote, either in making up any deficiency in the amounts actually received as credits in aid, or in defraying expenditure which is not adequately provided for by appropriation.

(4.) An abstract certified by the Audit Office of all amounts temporarily applied as aforesaid shall be included in the abstract of the Unauthorized Expenditure Account required to be laid before Parliament, as provided in section fifty-four of the Public Revenues

Act, 1910.

(5.) This section is in substitution for section forty-eight of the Public Revenues Act, 1910, and that section and also section twelve of the Finance Act, 1922, are hereby accordingly repealed.

(6.) This section shall operate as from the first day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, and shall continue in force until

it is specifically repealed.

23. (1.) Section thirty-seven of the Finance Act, 1922, is hereby amended by inserting, after subsection three, the following subsections:—

- "(3a.) In lieu of making and levying a special rate as security for any debentures issued under the last preceding subsection in respect of the purchase of the aforesaid railway, such debentures may be secured in manner following.
- "(3B.) The owners of any land in the district may, by deed or other instrument, agree to contribute the amount required for the

payment of interest, principal, and other charges in respect of the cost of such railway by means of a royalty at such rate or rates as may be fixed in the agreement on the timber from time to time produced from the lands of the several owners.

"(3c.) Every such agreement may be registered in the manner provided in the next succeeding subsection, and shall run with the land and bind the owners and their assigns and mortgagees in

the manner and to the extent provided in that subsection."

(2.) The Board of the local railway district, constituted pursuant to the said section thirty-seven, may, subject to the authority of an Order issued by the Governor-General in Council under section fifty of the Local Railways Act, 1914, construct and maintain a railway within its district for the primary purpose of enabling the timber on the timber-bearing lands within the district to be utilized.

(3.) The provisions of the Local Railways Act, 1914, shall apply with respect to any railway constructed or maintained by the Board

pursuant to this section.

(4.) The provisions of subsections two to six of the said section thirty-seven, including the provisions of subsections three(A), three(B), and three(C) inserted by the foregoing provisions of this section, shall, with the necessary modifications, apply with respect to the cost of construction of any railway under this section in the same manner as they apply with respect to the purchase of the railway referred to in that section.

(5.) In fixing rates of charges for the carriage of timber on any railway the Board may fix differential rates with respect to timber carried on behalf of persons bound by an agreement under this section with respect to the payment of royalties, and to timber carried on behalf of other persons, for the purpose, so far as may be, of equalizing the cost to the several owners of producing and marketing their timber, so far as such cost is affected by the payment of

royalties:

Provided that while any owner or other person bound by any such agreement is in default in the payment of any royalties or other charges in connection therewith the Board may, in its discretion, refuse to allow to such person the benefit of any such differential rate.

(6.) The power to fix differential rates conferred on the Board by the last preceding subsection shall be deemed to be conferred on any successor to, or purchaser from, that Board; and section eighty-three of the Local Railways Act, 1914, shall be construed subject to

the provisions of this subsection.

(7.) The powers conferred by subsections two to six hereof shall not be exercised, nor shall an Order in Council as referred to in the said subsection two be issued, unless the Governor-General in Council determines, upon such material as shall be deemed by the Governor-General in Council to be sufficient, that negotiations have been entered into in good faith by the Board with the Taupo Totara Timber Company (Limited) for the purchase by the Board of that company's railway, and that the terms or conditions required by the said company are unreasonable, having regard to all the present circumstances of the said railway.
