Title.                    AN ACT to amend the Summer Time Act, 1929.  
[15th December, 1933.]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short Title.            1. This Act may be cited as the Summer Time Amendment Act, 1933, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Summer Time Act, 1929 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

Extending period of summer time.

2. (1) The period of summer time ending in the year nineteen hundred and thirty-four or in any subsequent year shall continue until the last Sunday in April in such year.

(2) The period of summer time beginning in the year nineteen hundred and thirty-four or in any subsequent year shall begin on the last Sunday in September in such year.

(3) Subsection two of section two of the principal Act is hereby consequentially amended as follows:—

- (a) By omitting the words “second Sunday in October”, and substituting the words “last Sunday in September”; and
- (b) By omitting the words “third Sunday in March”, and substituting the words “last Sunday in April”.
